The Treasure of Lemon Brown

- **1.** (iv) Greg will probably fail math
- 2. (ii) was a famous blues singer

- 4. Lemon Brown's role in the story is to teach Greg the value of family. Greg realizes that his father cares about him after his conversation with Lemon Brown. Lemon Brown tells Greg about his son Jesse and what their relationship meant to him. "If you know your pappy did something" shows Greg that he should be happy that his father cares about him.
- 5. Explaining Cause and Effect

Greg helped protect Lemon Brown against the thugs, so now Lemon Brown realizes that Greg has not come to steal his treasure, and that he can trust him. Fighting the thugs together is the cause, Lemon Brown trusting Greg, "you okay for a youngster", is the effect.

14. The Road Not Taken

Frost usually began his poems with a description of nature, which he then connected to a real life situation.

The poem speaks about a person standing in a forest who tries to decide which road to take. He stands there for a long time ("long I stood"). We can see that the poem is a metaphor for real life. The speaker in the poem isn't really in a forest, but in a dilemma between two decisions in life. That is exactly how Frost wanted us to understand the poem. Not literally but as an allegory for a real life situation.
